# CITY OF TARRANT COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES JULY 17, 2023 TARRANT CITY HALL

The City Council of the City of Tarrant, Alabama, met in a regularly scheduled meeting on Monday, July 17, 2023, at 7:00PM at City Hall.

Mayor Wayman A. Newton called the meeting to order at 7:03PM following the council work session that began at 6:00PM to discuss items on the agenda and other matters.

Fire Chief Patrick Bennett lead those in attendance in the invocation. Mr. Scott Evans lead those present in the pledge of allegiance.

Mayor Newton asked for a roll call. The following officials were present during the roll call:

A quorum was determined to be present at the meeting.

The minutes from the June 21, 2023, regularly scheduled council meeting and the minutes from the July 11, 2023, called council meeting were presented for review and approval. After review, Councilor Threadford moved to approve both the minutes from the June 21, 2023, and the July 11, 2023, meetings as presented. Councilor Anderson seconded the motion. Mayor Newton called for a roll call vote.

The yeas being four (4) and the nays being zero (0) with one (1) member not voting, the motion to approve payment of the vouchers and expenses as presented was agreed to.

Next, the City Council heard from members of the public who had signed up to speak prior to the meeting.

First, Mr. Chuck Winborn, member of the Tarrant Crime Commission, spoke regarding the crime commission's recent tour of the jail. Mr. Winborn stated the new flooring in the dispatch area was getting torn up because there were not mats commonly used with rolling chairs at the dispatchers' desks. Mr. Winborn requested those items be approved for purchase. Additionally, Mr. Winborn stated there were 2 areas within the jail itself that needed cameras for security purposes.

Second, Mr. Church Clark, of the Brummitt Heights Neighborhood Association spoke regarding street paving in the area, need for speed breakers along Waverly and Treadwell Roads, and traffic light placement at the intersection of Tarrant-Huffman and Treadwell Roads. The council reminded those in attendance that Jefferson County was responsible for maintaining Treadwell Roads and any placement of a light (caution or traffic signal) is solely the responsibility of Jefferson County. Councilor Matthews requested any speed breakers installed to be like those on Horton Avenue.

Third, Mr. Pullman spoke regarding the city manager, the on-going litigation, and the attorneys' fees being spent on defending the litigation. He also addressed the council requesting increased police presence to monitor an intersection at Enfield Street where vehicles were routinely running that stop sign.

This concluded comments from the public.

Finally, Councilor Threadford stated the property at 2037 Woodrow Street be evaluated as a potential public nuisance. Additionally, she stated that speed breakers were needed on Woodrow Street along with Fulton and Alabama Streets to be evaluated as well.

There being no further business to be brought before the council, Councilor Threadford moved to adjourn the meeting. Mayor Newton seconded the motion. A voice vote was taken with all present being in favor.

The meeting was adjourned at 8:90pm.

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF AN INVITATION TO BID FOR THE PURCHASE OF PLAYGROUND EQUIPMENT TO BE PLACED AT BRUMMITT HEIGHTS PARK AND DEPOT STREET PARK AT EAST BOYLES.

WHEREAS, the City of Tarrant, Alabama ("City") is responsible for maintaining Brummitt Heights Park (the "Park"), a public park located within its corporate limits; and

WHEREAS, the Park's existing playground equipment has become well-worn and outdated creating a need for new playground equipment to be purchased for installation at the Park; and

WHEREAS, based on previous estimates, it is projected the costs of the playground equipment will exceed \$15,000.00 requiring the purchase of the play equipment to be let for competitive bidding as required by Title 41 of the Code of Alabama (1975); and

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City finds it in the best interest of the health, safety, and welfare of its citizens to authorize an invitation to bid to be issued for the purchase of playground equipment for use at the Park.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of Tarrant, Alabama while in regular session on Monday, August 7, 2023, at 7:00 p.m. as follows:

- **Section 1.** The above-stated preamble is hereby adopted and incorporated as if fully set out herein.
- Section 2. The Mayor or his designee is authorized to issue an Invitation to Bid for the purchase of playground equipment at Brummitt Heights Park and the subsequent installation of the equipment.
- Section 3. Sealed bids for the must be received at Tarrant City Hall located at 1133 East Lake Boulevard, Tarrant, Alabama 35217 at a date and time to be determined and identified in the Invitation to Bid at which time the bids will be publicly opened and read aloud in the Tarrant City Hall Council Chambers.
- Section 4. The City reserves the right to modify, substitute, or cancel the Invitation to Bid as well as the right to reject any or all bids, to waive any or all

irregularities, and/or informalities in any bid, and to negotiate and award a contract in any manner, consistent with law, and deemed in the best interest of the City.

Section 5. The awarding of any bid shall occur at a subsequent meeting of the City Council and shall be conditioned upon the negotiation and execution of a contract containing the material terms of those stated in the Invitation to Bid.

Section 6. This Resolution shall become effective immediately upon its passage.

A RESOLUTION REQUESTING QUOTES FOR REPAIR OF BATHROOMS AT BRUMMITT HEIGHTS PARK AND DIRECTING IMMEDIATE REPAIR OF ITEM AT PARK.

WHEREAS, the City of Tarrant, Alabama, ("City") is responsible for the maintenance and upkeep of Brumitt Heights Park ("Park") a public park within the corporate limits of the City; and

WHEREAS, the bathroom facilities at the Park are non-operational or are otherwise in need of repairs (see photographs of the facilities attached as Exhibit "A"); and

WHEREAS, in addition to the bathroom facilities at the Park, there are other conditions at the Park which need to be addressed as part of the maintenance as well as to continue to make the Park safe for all citizens and visitors who may use the Park.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** by the City Council of the City of Tarrant, Alabama, at a regular meeting, duly assembled, a quorum being present as follows:

Section 1. The above-stated preamble is hereby adopted and incorporated as if fully set out herein.

Section 2. The Mayor, or his designee, is hereby authorized to engage a plumber or other repairman or contractor for the purposes of inspecting and completing all necessary repairs to the bathrooms in order to restore the bathroom to functional status. Provided, however, that in the event the estimated costs of repair exceeds \$15,000.00 for the bathrooms, the itemized list of repairs shall be bid as required by the Competitive Bid Law codified in Title 41 of the Code of Alabama (1975), and the Council hereby authorizes the issuance of an invitation to bid should it be required based on the amount of the repairs. Alternatively, the public works department may be directed to perform the repair of the items if possible.

Section 3. Further, the City's Public Works Department shall, within five (5) calendar days of this Resolution respond to the Park and remove and hazardous conditions which may exist including those identified in Exhibit "B" to this Resolution. In the event additional time is needed to complete these items, the Director of Public Works shall be present at the next scheduled council meeting to explain the necessity for the additional time that is needed

Section 5. This Resolution shall become effective immediately upon its adoption and passage.




<u>Section 1</u>. The compensation of all municipal employees, not designated as a public safety employee shall be increased in the amount of fifteen percent (15%) beginning on August 1, 2023.

Section 2. A copy of this Resolution shall be transmitted to the Jefferson County Personnel Board with a request the Personal Board of Jefferson County acknowledged and adjust the City's employee schedule accordingly as this request is not within twelve (12) months of an applicable election which would require the Personal Board of Jefferson County's approval.

<u>Section 3.</u> All expenditures, as well as any necessary or required taxes, benefits, and pension contributions shall be paid from the City's General Fund.

Section 4. This resolution shall become effective immediately upon its adoption and passage.

WHEREAS, the City of Tarrant, Alabama (hereinafter at times referred to as City) is desirous of having certain improvements made within the City Limits of Tarrant, in accordance with plans prepared by the Alabama Department of Transportation and designated as Project Number: STPAA-NR13(909) Replacement of Non-compliant Curb Ramps on State Routes.

WHEREAS, The Alabama Department of Transportation is now or may later be desirous of receiving Federal Aid for improvement of said highway; and

WHEREAS, The Federal Highway Administration, an agency of the United States of America, will not participate in any funding for the construction of said project until and unless the City will agree to certain requirements of the Federal Highway Administration. The City, for the purpose of complying with requirements of the Federal Highway Administration in regard to its funding of improvements of the type and kind in this agreement provided for, does hereby pass and adopt the following resolution:

BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of Tarrant, that the plans of said project including alignment, profile, grades, typical sections and paving layouts as submitted to this City and which are now on file in the office of the City Clerk are hereby approved and that the location of said project as staked out by the Alabama Department of Transportation and as shown by said plans referred to are hereby approved and the Alabama Department of Transportation, in cooperation with the Federal Highway Administration, is hereby authorized to proceed with the grading, draining, paving, and otherwise improving and construction of said project in accordance with said plans.

The City by and through its Council hereby grants to the Alabama Department of Transportation the full use of and access to the dedicated widths of any existing streets for the construction of said project and hereby agrees to permit and allow the Alabama Department of Transportation to close and barricade the said project and intersecting streets for as long as necessary while the said project is being graded, drained, paved, and otherwise improved, and hereby agrees that the use of any street or highway for parking within an interchange area will not at any time be permitted.

The City hereby further agrees to adopt or pass such legally effective ordinances and/or laws as will permanently barricade and/or relocate certain intersecting streets as required by the State and to permanently deny or limit access at certain locations as required by the State along said improvements, all of which are more specifically stated as follows:

This project does not require the relocation or barricading of any i	intersecting streets.

Department of Transportation in cooperation with the Federal Highway Administration, constructing said highway and routing traffic along the same through the City over said project, such City hereby agrees with the Alabama Department of Transportation and for the benefit of the Federal Highway Administration, that on the above mentioned project the City will not in the future permit encroachments upon the right of way; nor will it pass any ordinances or laws fixing a speed limit contrary to those limits provided for in Title 32, Chapter 5, Code of Alabama 1975, as amended, and other laws of Alabama; nor will it permit other than parallel parking in areas where parking is permitted; nor will it allow the placing of any informational, regulatory, or warning signs, signals, median crossover, curb and pavement or other markings, and traffic signals without written approval of the Alabama Department of Transportation and the Federal Highway Administration, of the location, form and character of such installations. The traffic control devices and signs installed during construction, and those installed after completion of this project shall be in accordance with the latest edition of the national Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices and accepted standards adopted by the Alabama Department of

Transportation of the State of Alabama and by the Federal Highway Administration. The City further agrees that subsequent traffic control devices deemed necessary by it in keeping with applicable statutes, rules and regulations to promote the safe and efficient utilization of the highway under the authority of Title 32, Chapter 5, Code of Alabama 1975, and all other applicable laws of Alabama, shall be subject to and must have the approval of the Alabama Department of Transportation of the State of Alabama and of the Federal Highway Administration, prior to installation and the City further agrees that it will enforce traffic and control the same under the provisions of Title 32, Chapter 5, Code of Alabama 1975, and other applicable laws of Alabama.

#### BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by this City Council:

- 1. That the City agrees to perform all maintenance on crossroads, service drives, or relocated roads that are not designated Federal or State highways that are in the jurisdiction of the City.
- 2. That the City agrees to perform all maintenance on any existing road which has been replaced by a new road; or, if the existing road is not used, the City has the option of vacating same.
- 3. That the City agrees to perform all maintenance on interchanges to the theoretical crossing of the denied access line.
- 4. That the City agrees to perform all maintenance on grade separations along the roadway to the end of the bridge, or the denied access fence, whichever the case.

### A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING AND APPROVING OF THE REPAIR OF THE TARRANT RECREATION CENTER ROOF.

WHEREAS, the City of Tarrant, Alabama ("City") is responsible for the maintenance of the Tarrant Recreation Center ("TRC;") and

WHEREAS, significant leaks have developed in the TRC roof causing the need for immediate repair in order to prevent and forego any property damage as well as keep the patrons who use the TRC safe; and

WHEREAS, based on previous estimates provided, it is projected the costs of the playground equipment will not exceed \$50,000.00 which is under the public works bidding threshold as required by Title 39 of the Code of Alabama (1975); and

WHEREAS, the City has received one estimate for repair from Birmingham Roofing & Sheet Metal, Inc., (attached as Exhibit "A").

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City finds it in the best interest of the health, safety, and welfare of its citizens to authorize the repair of the roof as stated in Exhibit A.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of Tarrant, Alabama while in regular session on Monday, August 3, 2023, at 7:00 p.m. as follows:

Section 1. The above-stated preamble is hereby adopted and incorporated as if fully set out herein.

Section 2. Pursuant to the estimates obtained and a review of same by the City Council, the Mayor is hereby authorized to enter into an agreement with Birmingham Roofing & Sheet Metal Inc. to provide the materials, installation, and labor for the necessary roof repair at the TRC in according to the terms of the estimate attached as Exhibit "A."

Section 3. In accordance with the estimate, the amount of \$32,400.00 the TRC roof repair is hereby authorized to be paid from the City's General Fund.

Section 4. This Resolution shall become effective immediately upon its passage.

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Mr. Evans, Thank you for the opportunity to inspect the existing roof and provide a proposal for the above referenced property.

Our investigation shows an existing roof construction, approximately 3,000SF, that consists of a granulated sheet torched down built-up roof system that is over an original roof. There are three vent pipe penetrations. The roof system shows signs of significant aging. The gutters and downspouts are adequate. The gutters are full of debris and need to be cleaned. An investigation of the interior shows water penetration along the clerestory at the northeast corner.

Due to the age of the existing roof system, we can propose to address the aforementioned leak on a time & material basis that would could be up to \$1,800.00 per day.

We also propose to remove and properly dispose of the existing roof system and furnish and install a 60 mil TPO roof system with R-30 rigid insulation. We will include new base flashing and counterflashing at the walls We will "sump" the insulation at the eaves with ¼" tapered insulation to facilitate positive draining. Flashing will be 24-gauge G-90 galvanized. All flashings will be installed according to manufacturer's recommendations. Existing gutters & downspouts will remain in place. We will provide a manufacturer's 20 year No Dollar Limit (NDL) warranty. Because we are certified by the manufacturer, we can perform annual inspections and maintenance for a nominal fee and increase the warranty period to 25 years. The cost of our work would be \$32,400.00.




