The City Council of the City of Tarrant, Alabama, met in a regularly scheduled meeting on Monday July 7, 2025, at 7:00 PM at City Hall.

Mayor Newton called the meeting to order at 7:00 PM immediately following the council work session that began at 6:00PM to discuss items on the agenda and other matters.

Chris Patterson lead those in attendance in the invocation. Fire Chief Patrick Bennett, lead those present in the Pledge of Allegiance.

After the public comments, Councilor Threadford made a motion to adjourn. Councilor Anderson seconded the motion. A verbal vote was taken. Meeting adjourned at 7:38 pm.

# CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF TARRANT, ALABAMA RESOLUTION NO. 9264

#### A RESOLUTION REMOVING CHIEF WENDELL MAJOR FROM THE OFFICE OF CHIEF OF POLICE FOR THE CITY OF TARRANT

WHEREAS, following the findings of an April, 2024 independent investigation into the Office of the Chief of Police of the City of Tarrant, which revealed multiple are of serious misconduct on the part of Chief Wendell Major, the City Council of the City of Tarrant has continual declined to remove Chief Major from office;

WHEREAS, since that April, 2024 report, said misconduct has continued and/or escalated, exposing law enforcement officers, the citizens and the City of Tarrant to serious harm; and

WHEREAS, this ongoing misconduct includes: (a) continual closing of law enforcement cases preventing and/or obstructing active investigations (including cases which involve domestic and/or gun violence); (by retaliation in violation of the Civil Rights Act of 1964; (c) allowing unauthorized personnel unsupervised access to sensitive and confidential areas of the Public Safety Burnding (including former employees who were terminated for misconduct), (d) Inting personnel outside the rules, policies and procedures as outlined by the Lefferman County Personnel Board and (e) approving contracts, services and/or expenditures without prior authorization.

WHEREAS, based on the findings of misconduct from the April, 2024 independent investigation and the current, ongoing misconduct and exposure to harm to law enforcement officers citizens and the City of Tarrant, Chief Wendell Major is due to be removed from the Office of the Chief of Police of the City of Tarrant for cause.

Nabama while in regular session on Monday, July 21st, 2025 at 7:00 p.m. as follows:

Section 1. That the City Council of the City of Tarrant does hereby immediately remove, for cause, Wendell Major from the Office of the Chief of Police for the City of Tarrant by a majority vote of those elected to the Council.





#### **RESOLUTION NO. 9320**

### A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY OF TARRANT DECLARING CERTAIN PROPERTIES A PUBLIC NUISANCE

WHEREAS, an abundance of weeds and overgrown vegetation provide favorable conditions for the harboring of mosquitoes and other insects of like kind, and do otherwise have a negative impact on the health and safety of the citizens of Tarrant;

**WHEREAS**, Ordinance No. 1017 of the City of Tarrant was designed to deter and provide for the abatement of weeds and overgrown vegetation;

WHEREAS, on July 21, 2025, a public hearing was held before the City Council of Tarrant, Alabama, to determine whether certain properties constituted a public nuisance by reason of overgrown grass, weeds, and/or other voluntary or spontaneous growth; and

**WHEREAS**, the appropriate notice called for in Ordinance No. 1017 was given to the person or persons in possession of, in ownership of, or in charge or control of said property, with respect to the public hearing.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of Tarrant, Alabama, as follows:

Section 1. The above-stated preamble is hereby adopted and incorporated as if fully set forth herein.

Section 2. The properties on the list attached hereto as Exhibit "A" are hereby determined to be a nuisance by reason that the abundance of overgrown grass and/or weeds within the City is injurious to the general public health, safety, and general welfare by providing breeding grounds and shelter for rats, mice, snakes, mosquitoes, and other vermin, insects, and pests; that the height and dryness of said overgrown grass and weeds constitutes a serious fire threat or hazard; that said overgrown grass and weeds produces allergens that cause irritation to the throat, lungs, and eyes of the public; that said overgrown grass and weeds hides debris that could inflict injury on persons going upon the property; and/or that said overgrown grass and weeds are unsightly and in excess of twelve (12) inches in height.

Section 3. Said nuisance shall be abated as provided for in Ordinance No. 1017 of the City of Tarrant, Alabama.


Section 4. Those individuals abating the nuisance described herein shall render an itemized report in writing to the City Council showing the cost of removing the nuisance. Before the report is submitted to the City Council, a copy of the report shall be posted for at least five days prior thereto on or near the chamber door of the City Council, together with a notice of the time when the report shall be submitted to the City Council for confirmation.

WHEREAS, contemporaneously with Finding of Public Nuisance and Declaration of Emergency, notice was sent certified mail via United States Postal Service, properly addressed and postage prepaid, to the following regarding the individual buildings and/or structures at issue:

- A. All person or persons, firm, association, or corporation last assessing the subject property for state taxes to the address on file in the Jefferson County Tax Collector's Office,
- B. The record property owner or owners (including any owner or owners of an interest in the subject property) as shown from a search of records of the office the judge of Probate of Jefferson County, Alabama, at the owner or owners' last known address and at the address of the subject property,
- C. All mortagees of record as shown from a search of the records of the office of the Judge of Probate of Jefferson County, Alabama, to the address set forth in the mortgage or, if no address for the mortgageee is set forth in the mortgate, to the address determined to be the correct address by the Appropriate Municipal Official,
- D. All lien holders of record as shown from a search of the records of the office of the Judge of Probate of Jefferson County, Alabama to the address set forth in the statement of lien or, if no address for the lien holder is set forth in the statement of lien, to the address determined to be the correct address by the Appropriate Municipal Official,
- E. Such other persons who are otherwise known to the Appropriate Municipal Official who could have an interest in the subject property.

**Section 3.** That said demolition is to be performed by the City of Tarrant; and

Section 4. That the City Attorney and the City Clerk are hereby directed to cause the cost of such demolition to be charged against the land on which the building or structure is located and shall constitute a lien on the property for the amount of the assessment or cause such cost to be recovered in a suit at law against the owner or owners.

#### **Dangerous Buildings Checklist**

The Appropriate Municipal Official finds that the building located on the Subject Property is a "dangerous building" within the meaning of the City of Tarrant, Alabama's ordinance, as amended, governing unsafe structures and dangerous buildings because of the following defects:

#### CHECK EACH FINDING THAT APPLIES.

- (1) The interior walls or other vertical structure members list, lean, or buckle to such an extent that a plumb line passing through the center of gravity falls outside of the middle third of its base;

- (5) The building has become or is so damaged, dilapidated, decayed, unsafe, unsanitary, lacking in maintenance, vermin or rat infested, containing filth or contamination, lacking proper ventilation, lacking sufficient illumination, or so utterly fails to provide the amenities essential to decent living that it is unfit for human habitation, or is likely to cause sickness or disease, so 10 day / 45 day public or the occupants;
- (6) The building has light, air, heating, cooling, and sanitation facilities which are inadequate to protect the life, health, property, morals, safety, or general welfare of the public or the occupants;

(7) The building has inadequate facilities for egress in case of fire or panic, or has insufficient stairways, elevators, fire escapes, or other means of ingress and egress to and from said building;

- (9) The building contains unsafe equipment, including any boiler, heating equipment, elevator, moving stairway, electrical wiring or device, flammable liquid containers, or other equipment on the premises or within the structure which is in such disrepair or condition that such equipment is a hazard to the life, health, property, morals, safety, or general welfare of the public or the occupants;
- (10) The building is so damaged, decayed, dilapidated, structurally unsafe, or of such fault construction or unstable foundation that partial or complete collapse is possible;
- which are so attached that they may fall and damage property or injure the public or the occupants;
- (12) The building, or any portion thereof, is clearly unsafe for its use or occupancy;
- (13) The building is neglected, damaged, dilapidated, unsecured, or abandoned so as to become an attractive nuisance to children who might play in or on the building, structure, part of building or structure, party wall, or foundation to their danger, has become a harbor for vagrants, criminals, or immoral persons, or enables persons to resort to the building, structure, part of building or structure, party wall, or foundation for committing a nuisance or an unlawful act;
- \_\_\_\_\_(14) The building has a portion remaining on a site after the demolition or destruction of the same or is abandoned so as to constitute such building, structure, part of building or structure, party wall, or foundation as an attractive nuisance or hazard to the public;
- (15) The building is, because of its condition, unsafe, unsanitary, or dangerous to the life, health, property, morals, safety, or general welfare of the public or the occupants; and

(16) The building has a condition or violation of the terms of the City's ordinance, as amended, governing unsafe structures and dangerous conditions that violate the City's technical codes adopted from time to time if such violation(s) are unsafe to the buildings. extent of becoming a public nuisance.
